Format

(All races subject to change depending on number of entries in events)

Team Event will be Round Robin format with 5 games
 (2 of 501, 2 of Cricket and final game of 501 with 2 players on each of 4 scoring positions).

Level 1 of Team Event will be Round Robin format with 5 games
 (2 of 501, 2 of Cricket and final game of 701 with 2 players on each of 4 scoring positions).

Finals of team, race to 3 (best of 5). Level 1 team finals race to 4 (best of 7).

All Singles and Doubles events are '01 and Cricket Combo and Double Elimination.

Singles & Open Doubles: Level 1 race to 3 winner & losers side
 Level 2 & 3 race to 2 winner & losers side

Mixed Doubles: Level 1 race to 3 winners side, race to 2 losers side.
 Level 2 & 3 race to 2 winner & losers side

Team and Doubles events will use the Freeze Rule unless specified differently.

In the double elimination events, flip to start, winner of flip starts. Loser starts next game, rotate 01/cricket/01, etc. If tie-breaker game is needed, flip and diddle. Winner of diddle get to choose to go first or pick game 01/cricket.

Additional levels may be added as needed. Races subject to change depending on number of entries.

Registration Fees

Singles Events	\$36 per person* (Includes \$12 board fee)
Doubles Events	\$72 per team* (Includes \$24 board fee)

Junior Event	\$6 deposit (Get \$5 back when check in on Sunday)

*All events include a \$9 per person administrative fee (except Junior event).
 No quarters, coin drop is included in entry fee.

Blind Draws: All players must be NDA sanctioned. Can not play in Friday blind draw and Mixed Double event.

All eligible participants can sign up for all events. No conflicts except for blind draws on Friday & Saturday night.

Player Eligibility

A. All tournament players must:

1. Have been sanctioned by the National Dart Association for the 2024-2025 membership year to compete.
2. Play in leagues conducted by National Dart Association Operator members in good standing and are in compliance with all league-sanctioning guidelines.
3. Compete during regular league play on qualifying machines owned and operated by National Dart Association Operator members.
4. Be entered in the tournament by the National Dart Association Operator on whose machine(s) they have completed the minimum game requirements for tournament entry.
5. Have a National Dart Association Player Skill Rating using the Points Per Dart (PPD) and/or Marks Per Round (MPR) performance rating system for the event in which they are entered to be classified. These performance ratings require a player to have played a **minimum of 48 games** during the qualifying period Jan. 8, 2024 thru Dec. 13, 2024. Players without a valid PPD or MPR will be classified as a Level 1 player.

B. All tournament teams must:

1. For 4-Person Team event:

Declare a full team roster, including substitutes, when registering. Participate in the same league system and have formed a tournament team meeting the criteria. Each person on the team roster must also meet all of the player requirements listed under Player/Team Eligibility.

2. For Mixed Doubles event:

Participate in the same league system and have formed a tournament team meeting the criteria. Teams consist of one female and one male player. Each person on the team roster must also meet all of the player requirements listed under Player/Team Eligibility.

3. For Open Doubles event:

Can be from different league systems. Have formed a tournament team meeting the criteria. Each person on the team roster must also meet all of the player requirements listed under Player/Team Eligibility.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR *ONSITE* ALTERNATES

- Alternate must be from the same league system.
- Alternate must meet all eligibility requirements with stats on file on-site.
- Alternate's skill rating must be **LESS THAN** or **EQUAL TO** the player they are replacing.
- In mixed events, the alternate must be of the same gender.

Substitute players for Doubles and Teams: (prior to Dec. 13):

Teams may use a substitute from within the same league system as long as the substitute player has competed in the same league format as the regular players. Regular team substitutes should be entered on the regular player certificate.

Onsite Alternate Rule (applies after Dec. 13):

An alternate must be from the same league system and meet all the player requirements noted in Player/Team Eligibility. Alternate players must be rated equal to or less than the player they are replacing. It is recommended that possible alternates be submitted, with their statistics, prior to the tournament by your operator to avoid delays. Onsite approval for alternates not already participating in the tournament can be requested by a Operator, with appropriate league statistics, within the time frame noted. For mixed events, the alternate player must also be of the same gender. No roster changes are allowed in finals. Absolutely no one can serve as an alternate on more than one team per event. Any players on your team roster for that event may be rotated in match-by-match, not between games.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON FOUR PERSON TEAM EVENT

- A) A team will be given a 15 minute grace period for first round matches. There will be no grace period after the first round.
- B) If less than 3 players are present 15 minutes after the scheduled start time, that team will be forfeited from the event.
- C) If a team is missing a player after the 15 minute grace period, it may begin the match with 3 players, and it must finish the entire round robin with those 3 players.
- D) Incapacitated player: Is defined as a player who is unable to compete. (This includes a player who leaves.) If a player is deemed incapacitated and no qualified substitute player is on that team's roster, that team will be forfeited from the event. It is the responsibility of the players and team to prevent this from occurring.

Forfeiting Team: If a team should not finish a round robin for any reason, the following procedures will apply.

- A) If the advancement of teams is affected, all wins obtained against the offending team will be subtracted from the win totals.
- B) If no team advancement is affected, all win totals will stay intact.
- C) Any team (all rostered players) not completing a round robin will be suspended from competition in Colorado NDA State Tournament for two years.

For emergency situations, tournament committee will review each case and determine if suspension is valid or not.

The tournaments committee has the discretion to expedite play as needed, including, but not limited to, having a match play on two boards. When starting on two boards, the home team starts on board one and the visitor team starts on board two as identified by the referee. Loser of first game starts third game and loser of second game starts fourth game.
